## 1816 - 1840

The MHS was founded on March 17, 1829. Most of the letters and related documents in the Early Correspondence File deal with Society business, a few letters identified predate the founding of the MHS. Topics include MHS business, membership, acquisitions for the Library and horticultural subjects. Additional identifying information relating to the authors and recipients is included.
